Today our classes received their Jump Rope for Heart thank you prizes. Well done everyone on raising well over \$2000 for the Heart Foundation.



Semester Two Reports - Reports will be sent home on Presentation day. Key Points to remember are;

- A separate report letter for literacy and numeracy should be read closely, followed by the child's continuum report page. These letters will describe the Progression of Learning area that each student should be in and a list of achievements at each level.
- We have still reported for Science, Geography, Creative Arts and Personal development/ Health and Physical Education in the traditional way.
- We are still including an A-E grade for each subject. Remember a SOUND means that the child has learnt everything they have been taught this semester. To get HIGH the child must be showing work beyond that level.
- Also an important point is that we work in <u>stages</u>. This means that when a child enters Year I, Year 3 and Year 5 they are at the very beginning of 2 years of learning. If they receive a SOUND then they are doing well as the learning of that concept takes place over the 2 years.
- Early Stage I is Kindergarten over I year.
- Stage I is Years I and 2 (over 2 years).
- Stage 2 is Years 3 and 4 (over 2 years)
- Stage 3 is Years 5 and 6 (over 2 years).
- We are still giving an effort score. I being 'limited effort' to 5 being 'tries their best at all times'.

#### **Presentation Day Awards**

I have included a list of major awards for the year and tried to explain the process of selection. Teachers discuss at length award winners and recipients can be selected right up until presentation week.

<u>K – 5 Year Awards</u> – Outstanding Academic Performance in each Grade

K- 5 Class Awards – Given to I person per class for class citizenship, effort or improvement

Year 6 – Dux – Outstanding Academic Performance

Year 6 Citizenship – Outstanding citizenship and representation

<u>K-6 Col O'Regan Encouragement award</u> – Any student in K-6 that shows growth, effort and always tries their best.

Library Awards - One per class for effort, borrowing, research and library skills

<u>Sports Awards</u> – Western Region Sport Representatives

<u>Creative Arts Award</u> – Outstanding creative achievements

Public Speaking Awards – Junior and Senior Public Speaking

Leadership Badges – 2016 student leaders – 4 students elected by students through school voting system

House Points Trophy – Presented to winning House for 2016

#### Working with Children Check for Unrelated Volunteers – Compulsory in 2017

<u>Parents and grandparents</u> of children at the school who wish to volunteer next year must sign a Statutory Declaration that complies with section 40A of the Child Protection (Working with Children) Act 2012. 100 points of identification must also be provided at the time of bringing in the paperwork. For example a passport and drivers license.

<u>Please note</u> Parents and grandparents are <u>not</u> required to obtain the Working with Children Check number through the kidsguardian and the RMS. This declaration is then valid for 5 years. Thank you to those parents who have completed the required documentation. All forms are available from Mrs Webb at the office.

Those volunteers <u>not related</u> to a child <u>are</u> required to obtain the Working With Children Check number through the kidsguardian and the RMS. This number must be provided to the school before undertaking any volunteer work. These have already been obtained by all staff, scripture teachers, band leaders and Quocka Volunteers.

#### **Closure of the Child Dental Benefits Schedule**

#### Q. When will the Child Dental Benefits Schedule be closed?

If the legislation passes, the Child Dental Benefits Schedule will close to all patients from 1 January 2017. This means that the cost of dental services provided on or after 1 January 2017 will not be met by the government, and will need to be met by the patient.

## Q. I received a letter advising that the Child Dental Benefits Schedule will be closed from I January 2017. I am unsure whether my child is eligible this year. How can I check this? You may check your child's eligibility for 2016 by checking your myGov account if you are registered or by calling the Department of Human Services on 132 011. If your child is eligible for 2016, you will be able to access the Child Dental Benefits Schedule until it closes from 1 January 2017.

## Q. Will my child be able to access dental benefits for dental services provided on or after I January 2017?

No. Dental benefits under the Child Dental Benefits Schedule will not be payable for any dental services provided from I January 2017. If your dentist charges a fee for dental services from this date, you will be responsible for payment. You may wish to discuss with your dentist the impact this change may have on arrangements for your child's continuing dental treatment.

## Q. I was told that my child has two calendar years to use the \$1,000. Can my child keep using his or her Child Dental Benefits Schedule entitlement until the two years runs out?

Your child can use his or her entitlement up until the closure of the Child Dental Benefits Schedule from I January 2017. Any dental services received by your child on or after I January 2017 will need to be paid for by you as no benefits will be available on or after this date. You may wish to discuss with your dentist the impact this change may have on arrangements for your child's continuing dental treatment.

## Q. What happens to the remainder of the cap if my child still has benefits available at the closure date (I January 2017)?

No further dental benefits will be payable from 1 January 2017, even if your child has not reached his or her cap at this date.

## Q. My child is halfway through his or her course of dental treatment. Can I finish the treatment?

You will be able to access the Child Dental Benefits Schedule for services provided before I January 2017. However, any dental services provided to your child on or after I January 2017 will need to be paid for by you as no benefits will be available from this date. You may wish to discuss with your dentist the impact this change may have on arrangements for your child's continuing dental treatment.

#### Q. Where can I get further information?

Information on the closure will be sent to all dentists and to all children/families who are eligible for the Child Dental Benefits Schedule. For specific questions, please contact the Department of Human Services (which administers the program) on **132 011 (patients)**.
