Dear Parents,

Thank you to everyone who came along and supported our students at last week's athletics carnival, it was a great day and our students really enjoyed all their races and activities.

LMBR (Learning Management and Business Reform)

Mrs Webb and Mrs James will be attending training over the next few months. Most training occurs on a Wednesday and Thursday. Mrs Rudge will be in the office on Thursday but we ask that phone calls and other office questions and requests be kept to a minimum on Wednesdays as Mrs Webb will not be replaced on this day.

Does your child bring a phone or I-pad to school?

These devices should be handed in at the front office each morning and collected after school each day. In the office they are stored in a secure area. We cannot be responsible for damage or incidents that occur whilst these are in children's school bags, on buses or during transit. Students need to remember cyber safety rules apply at all times and inappropriate use can be cause for disciplinary action.

Regular Attendance Is Important.

All children should be at school each day unless they are sick or have a reason for leave. All leave needs to be recorded with a note or a phone call to the front office. If you are taking family holidays we ask that you do so in school holiday times or if unavoidable please contact the office to inform us that students will be away. Longer holidays, greater than 15 days need special approval. We are then able to structure suitable work or ensure you child doesn't miss out on important lessons.

Our attendance data is checked each five weeks by the Home School Liaison Officer - Mr Peter Cross, so it is important that absences are recorded and leave from school is for approved reasons only. We appreciate your support with this matter.

Parking in Church Street

A reminder that there is a no parking sign at the southern end of Church Street. People are advised NOT to park in this 'No Standing' area as it inhibits those turning around. We will be opening the large gates near the bottom oval each morning and afternoon to smooth traffic congestion along Church Street so students can use both gates for arrival and departure.

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Reporting Scales of Achievement and Effort

Each child in Yrs1-6 receives both Achievement and Effort scales on their report for each Key Learning Area. Kindergarten only receives Effort. So that everyone is clear, I have again put in a summary of these scales. I do remind parents that **sound** means their child has understood the majority of the concepts taught and this is a good result.

Achievement Scale

A	Outstanding	The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.
B	High	The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.
C	Sound	The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.
D	Basic	The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a limited level of competence in the processes and skills.
E	Limited	The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.

Effort Scale

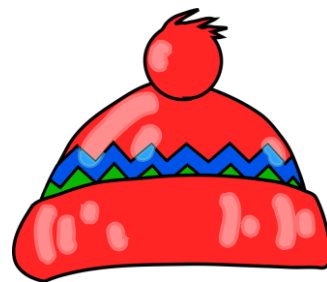
