From The Principal

Behaviour at School - Explanation of our Current Behavior Policy.

Perthville Public School has always set high expecatations for student behaviour and we always work with families to support students, who at times, make wrong choices. I would like to remind everyone that our **Orange Card** system is a chance for school and home to work together to ensure those high standards are maintained and parents stay informed about things that are happening at school.

Learning

Sometimes children make mistakes, sometimes they make wrong choices, sometimes they can be unkind, sometimes they do not respect school property or the property of others, sometimes they are rude to teachers, sometimes they do things that they own up to, or not. They are children, learning about peer relationships and acceptable social behaviour.

What happens when students make mistakes?

At school, we talk to **all students involved** about what choice they made, what they could do better next time and how their decision may impact others. We learn and we move on. Sometimes more serious behaviours result in more serious consequences - Yellow cards or red, which may lead to suspension.

Orange Cards

Not all orange cards require interviews with teachers or executive. Usually exec know about it, we talk to staff about what happened and the incident is recorded in our SENTRAL system and the orange card written and sent home.

Executive check the next day if the orange card **envelope** has been returned and we consider the matter dealt with. The student spends usually 1 session off play on the staffroom verandah, where they reflect.

Student Welfare - Discipline Policy

All students, teachers and parents have rights and responsibilities in creating and maintaining a stimulating, disciplined, safe and purposeful learning environment. At Perthville Public School we acknowledge that with rights comes responsibilities and we encourage our students to become successful and responsible citizens.

Students are expected to:

- Respect others, their property and school property
 Work and play safely at all times
 Not interrupt the learning of others
 Be in the right place at the right time

- Keep our hands to ourselves

New South Wales Core Rules

The department of education also has core rules that all students are expected to follow: These are as follows:

Students are expected to:

- Attend school every day, unless they are legally excused, and be in class on time and
- prepared to learn.

 Maintain a neat appearance, including adhering to the requirements of the school's uniform
- and dress code policy.

 Behave safely, considerately and responsibly, including when travelling to and from school.

 Show respect at all times for teachers, other staff and helpers, including following class rules, speaking courteously and cooperating with instructions and learning activities.
- Treat one another with dignity and respect
 Care for property belonging to themselves, the school and others.

Consequences for Inappropriate Behaviour

Warning letters are given to students if they choose not to follow school rules. We expect the letters to be taken home and given to parents or carers. We follow the 3, 2, 1 Approach.

3 Orange Warning Cards 2 Yellow Cards I Red Card

Consequences

If students do not follow classroom rules the following consequences will be implemented:

- × Loss Of Privileges including play time, Recorded by teacher
- × Orange Card Removal from Playground 1 session, Incident Report completed by student and teacher
- × 3 oranges cards result in the next being Yellow Parent Interview, Removal from Playground 1 day and forfeit 1 school
- × 2nd yellow card results in Parent interview, Removal from playground 1 week and forfeit upcoming school event or excursion rights for year, Referral to counsellor
- × Red card after 12th incident results in Parent Interview, Individual Behaviour Program, Counsellor & Behaviour Team Support, Short or Long Term Suspension

Students are encouraged to follow school rules. This will result in the following rewards:

- Positive reinforcement, House Points, Class awards
- Assembly awards
- Big Blue Awards
- Gold Awards
- Gold Medals
- Excursions
- Special Events
- End of Term Prizes




