

Special Shout Out to Perthville Metro and Bathurst RSL



The story is of a 9 year old boy who is orphaned in England in 1785. He is sent to work as a chimney Sweep in horrific conditions.


When he makes a plan to escape

Academic Reports- Update

This year we're introducing updated school reports. The new format has been developed by the NSW Department of Education in response to feedback from parents and educators to make reports easier to read and understand. Your child's report will still show their progress across all subject areas. Teacher comments will appear in English, Mathematics and the general comment section, in line with department policy. The general comment for Kindergarten also covers all other key learning areas including, creative arts, HSIE, PDHPE, and science and technology. A new <u>achievement scale and descriptions</u> are included to provide a clearer picture of your child's progress. Parent–teacher interviews remain an important way to discuss your child's progress and achievement in more detail. Semester One reports will come home in Week 10.


